On March 26, 2004, the SANDAG Board of Directors approved Option C of the draft 2004 STIP and authorized its submittal to the California Transportation Commission (attached).

+5 Status of 2004 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) Development

a) Revenue Assumptions

The attached report outlines issues that have caused delays in the development of financially constrained revenue assumptions for the 2004 RTIP. As a result, the conformity determination and adoption of the 2004 RTIP is likely to be postponed from the anticipated June 25, 2004 date to July 23, 2004.

Item #2: Summary of January 21, 2004 Meeting

There were no comments or corrections.

Item #3: Public Comments/Communications

There were none.

Item #4: 2004 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Development

Mr. Jose Nuncio, SANDAG, reviewed the information presented to the SANDAG Transportation Committee on February 6, 2004. He explained that the Committee reviewed the same three options discussed at the previous meeting and staff presented additional information on the potential cost of delaying projects versus financial costs of advancing them. Option C continues to be the preferred option, which would maximize the use of GARVEE bonds. The Transportation Committee is scheduled to make a recommendation to the Board of Directors on February 20. The Board would take action on March 26, 2004 for submittal to Caltrans and the California Transportation Commission (CTC) by April 12, 2004.

Mr. Nuncio also explained that Option C probably has the greatest risk of not being approved by the CTC since there is a ceiling on approval of GARVEE bonds at the statewide level, and SANDAG would be requesting up to \$260 million of the \$800 million statewide total. Also, two new projects which are not in the 2002 STIP would be included in the 2004 STIP. The I-15 Bus Rapid Transit project would be expanded beyond the freeway element and the Sprinter commuter rail, which was in previous RTIPs, would be added.

Ms. Elisa Arias, SANDAG, asked if Caltrans had issued correspondence agreeing to the use of the draft Fund Estimate for developing the 2004 RTIP. Mr. Badge, Caltrans Programming, agreed to check and inform the CWG. Mr. Wade Hobbs, FHWA, requested that SANDAG provide the financial assumptions for STP/CMAQ funding at future meetings.

Item #5: 2004 RTIP Development

Ms. Arias reported that tribal governments were contacted to solicit projects for inclusion in the 2004 RTIP and pointed to the sample letter and list of tribal governments included in the agenda.

Ms. Arias also referred to the map prepared by Caltrans District 11 that illustrates tribal lands in San Diego and Imperial counties.

Item #6: 2004 RTIP Conformity Criteria and Procedures

Ms. Arias consulted on the potential use of the Carbon Monoxide (CO) Maintenance Plan draft budget for the 2004 RTIP conformity. The California Air Resources Board (ARB) is expected to adopt the CO plan in May 2004 and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) could issue its budget adequacy finding prior to the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) conformity determination of the 2004 RTIP anticipated for early October 2004. Ms. Arias suggested conducting the conformity test for CO using both the currently approved CO budget and the draft budget from the 2003 Maintenance Plan. The analysis years for CO conformity would be 2010, 2020, and 2030. The CWG agreed with this approach.

Attached please find the San Diego Association of Governments' (SANDAG) 2004 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) submittal. In formulating the region's STIP recommendations, the SANDAG Board of Directors weighed various options in the face of no additional STIP funds, the potential termination of the Traffic Congestion Relief Program (TCRP) and the resulting project delays. As a result, the principal aim of our STIP recommendation is to maximize flexibility to deliver projects that are ready to acquire right of way or go to construction.

We propose that an aggressive amount of funding be financed through bonds. These include nearly \$253 million in Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicle (GARVEE) bonds, and \$80 million in locally-issued, STIP-backed bonds, for a total of nearly \$333 million in bond financing. Although we considered it, our analysis shows that adopting the "pay as you go" approach results in project delays and consequent significant cost increases in right of way acquisition and construction of projects. Two of the projects in our submittal have experienced cost increases in right of way acquisition averaging 20% per year over the past two years, with no sign of abating. More importantly, the project delays associated with the "pay as you go" approach would be to the detriment of commuters and long distance travelers, our ultimate customers. Lastly, over \$150 million in federal funds being leveraged with state and local funds are at risk if the region and the state do not take action now and demonstrate our ability to fund our share.

The SANDAG 2004 STIP submittal approximates the annual targets prescribed in the 2004 Fund Estimate (FE) with minor annual variances. The total submittal, including the anticipated annual debt service from the bond financing, is balanced versus the regional target of \$203.849 million. The bond financing has been estimated conservatively to account for potential fluctuations in financial market conditions.

The projects that our region is proposing to finance with GARVEE bonds are excellent candidates that follow the CTC guidelines. SR 905, for example, is a route that provides access to the Otay Mesa Port of Entry, California's largest commercial crossing with Mexico. Goods movement to and from this gateway will be made more efficient and reliable by this new freeway. The SR 52 project, will complete a critical east-west link and ease congestion on

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Interstate 8. SR 52 also provides connections to every north-south freeway, from Interstate 5 and its connections to the Los Angeles area, to SR 125, which will provide access to the Mexican border once it is completed in 2006. By GARVEE-bond financing and minimizing delay on the SR 52 right of way acquisition, significant cost increases will be avoided.

The SANDAG 2004 STIP submittal does include three continuation STIP projects. These projects should not be construed to be "new" projects as all three of them have previously been STIP-funded projects or are critical elements of other STIP-funded projects. These include the Oceanside-Escondido Light Rail Transit project, or Sprinter, received a STIP allocation as recently as April 2003. This project is leveraging over \$150 million in federal transit funds that if not used in California, will likely go to another state. The I-15 Managed Lanes Bus Rapid Transit System is the transit element of the I-15 Managed Lanes project, a GARVEE-financed project currently under construction. Without this transit element, the real life demonstration of the I-15 Managed Lanes concept will be many more years away, potentially undermining the implementation of this approach across the state. The SR 56 Landscaping project is a Coastal Commission permit requirement of the STIP financed SR 56 "Middle" freeway, currently under construction. Our region understands that in this time of fiscal uncertainty, no new projects should be proposed to be funded out of the STIP. We feel confident that our submittal follows the spirit of this approach. Our submittal is intended to complete those STIP projects we have started, and to complete them with all of the elements that are required to make them fully usable and environmentally compliant.

While our submittal reflects our desire to complete all of our STIP projects with minimal delays, we also understand that the CTC has to weigh the needs of the state versus the limitations placed by fiscal constraints. Our proposal assumes that the TCRP funds committed to the projects by the state will not be available in the near term, though with the expectation that they will eventually be available. We are willing to work with the commission and the Legislature to fully fund our region's projects whether through the STIP, the TCRP or other mechanisms to help the commission in its difficult task of programming the statewide STIP. Our region has demonstrated leadership and flexibility in innovative financing mechanisms in the past, and we remain committed to lead the way in partnership with the CTC to fund our transportation projects with resulting minimal delays.

SUBJECT: Status of 2004 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) Development

ACTION: DISCUSSION

At the December 17, 2003 meeting, we shared with the CWG the proposed schedule for the 2004 RTIP, including its air quality conformity determination and the redetermination of the 2030 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The schedule indicated that the SANDAG Board of Directors would be asked to make the conformity determinations and adopt the 2004 RTIP at its meeting on June 25, 2004. At subsequent CWG meetings we reviewed the latest planning assumptions that will be used to develop the 2004 RTIP conformity determination, except for the revenue assumptions.

The revenue assumptions continue to be in flux. Caltrans has notified all Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) that a region can only program federal funds up to its apportionment level – in other words, SANDAG cannot program prior year unobligated federal funds, a major shift in policy which will significantly impact San Diego. Also, over the past several CWG meetings, we reviewed SANDAG's 2004 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) which proposes GARVEE bonds to complete several regionally significant projects. SANDAG was recently notified that without a letter of intent from either the California Transportation Commission (CTC) or Caltrans, we will not be able to use the proposed GARVEE bonds as a revenue source in the 2004 RTIP.

In light of these developments, staff will not be able to develop revenue assumptions in time for a June 2004 RTIP adoption. Further, we anticipate having to revise the 2004 STIP for approval by the SANDAG Board of Directors and resubmit to the CTC.

We are hopeful that these issues will be resolved in a timely manner so that the 2004 RTIP can be submitted for inclusion into the 2004 Federal State Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) and obtain the U.S. Department of Transportation finding of conformity of the 2004 RTIP prior to a conformity or RTIP lapse on October 4, 2004. We will keep the CWG informed of any new developments.

We are transmitting our recommendations for area designations under the federal air quality standards for particulate matter 2.5 microns or less in diameter (PM2.5). On behalf of the State of California, the Air Resources Board (ARB) is responding to your June 3, 2003 letter to the Governor requesting these recommendations by February 15, 2004.

Four PM2.5 Nonattainment Areas. We base our initial recommendations on ambient PM2.5 concentrations measured from 2000 through 2002 by 110 monitors located at 81 stations across California. Pending complete data for 2003, ARB's preliminary recommendation is that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) designate four areas as nonattainment for the PM2.5 standards:

- South Coast Air Basin,
- San Joaquin Valley Air Basin,
- San Diego County, and
- City of Calexico (on the California-Mexico border in Imperial County).

Eight areas should be designated attainment, where air quality data are sufficient to determine that they meet the federal standards. Finally, 22 areas should be deemed unclassifiable, where air quality data are insufficient to make a determination yet.

Updated Monitoring Data. We understand that U.S. EPA intends to promulgate PM2.5 area designations by December 2004, based on monitoring data from 2001 through 2003. Preliminary 2003 information indicates that Calexico and several of the currently unclassifiable areas may now attain the PM2.5 standards. Before your final action, ARB will transmit PM2.5 monitoring data for 2003 and any appropriate changes to our initial recommendations for area designations.

Nonattainment Area Boundaries. The geographic scope of the federal PM2.5 nonattainment areas for the South Coast, San Joaquin Valley, and San Diego County should be consistent with the air basin boundary for each region. These coincide with the existing federal one-hour ozone nonattainment areas and ARB's recommended eight-hour ozone nonattainment areas as well.

ARB staff believes that violation of the annual PM2.5 standard in Calexico in 2000-2002 results from emissions in the densely populated international Calexico/Mexicali border region. The level of urban activity and PM2.5 pollution in the Calexico/Mexicali area are distinct and not representative of the rest of Imperial County. As a result, if Calexico violates the federal PM2.5 standard after consideration of 2003 data, we recommend that the U.S. nonattainment area be limited to the City of Calexico.
